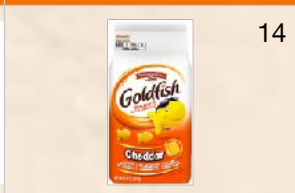
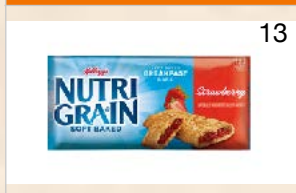

## Dance Club

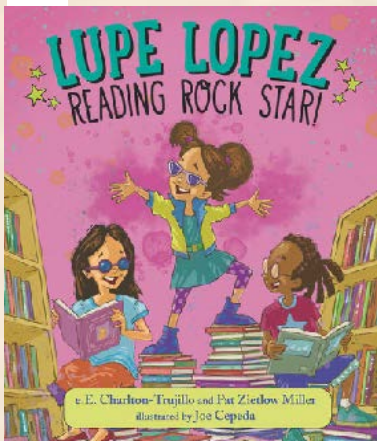
Move, groove, and have fun while learning new dance moves! Kids will explore different styles of dance, build confidence, and express themselves through music.
